How to Use the Map

This map is designed to give you information about your chosen major that will help keep you on track for graduation within 4 years. The sections on this page will help orient you to the "big picture" ideas such as the topics and areas of interest inside your major, the types of courses you will take, university policies including admissions, and other general topics. The chart on the second page will help you to develop a productive plan to make the most of your 4 years at ECU and prepare yourself for the job market after graduation.

Remember, it is important that you diversify your experiences, for success both in your degree program and outside of school. While coursework is important, it should not be your only focus. This Major Map will show you how to incorporate other kinds of experiences that will expand your knowledge of your chosen field and make you a more desirable job candidate.

The map is only a guideline. Remember to speak with your advisor often to learn about new opportunities, clarify concerns, and develop a plan that is right for you.

As a Political Science major, you will acquire experience and skills that are in demand by many employers. These include:

- 1. Critical thinking and analytical skills
- 2. Effective communication of your ideas to diverse audiences
- 3. The ability to make coherent arguments that are supported by data and scholarly research
- 4. Practical experience through relevant internships, participation in study abroad, data analysis, and/or foreign language proficiency

Keep in mind that your goal at ECU is preparing yourself to be marketable in your chosen career field. Taking advantage of the opportunities that are available to you outside of the classroom can help you to grow as a student and emerging professional, while also giving you the experience and skills that will be attractive to prospective employers.

WHAT CAN I LEARN?

A Political Science degree will help you expand your understanding of governments and societies and how their interactions influence policy-making. You will learn about a variety of political issues, current and historical events, and how governments make policies and deliver them to their citizens. This knowledge will help you to:

- Be a more informed citizen and constructive participant in public affairs;
- Develop the skills necessary to succeed in a professional environment;
- Understand concepts and theories essential to social science research, including the scientific method and the kinds of data and measurements that are used to assess political questions;
- Gain practical knowledge about the modern world and insights into the great issues of our age;
- Learn basic concepts relevant to the structures, powers, procedures, and problems of governments and organizations within the U.S. and around the globe;
- Identify and understand the factors that influence the political behavior of individuals;
- Examine political institutions, the social and economic forces that shape them, and the cultural context within which they operate;
- Analyze events in the international system and apply relevant theories and concepts to war and peace, economics, diplomacy, arms control, and threats to security.



ABOUT THE MAJOR

If you are interested in domestic or international politics, policy, law, government, or security, a political science degree is right for you. Our Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BS) in Political Science programs examine political institutions, the social and economic forces that shape them, the cultural context within which they operate, and human behavior in political matters. As a political science major, you will develop analytical and problem-solving abilities and improve your communication

skills, which are essential tools for all professions. If you choose the BS in Political Science as your major you can choose from four concentrations: Campaigns, Elections, and American Politics; International Relations and Comparative Politics; Pre-Law; and Public Administration and Policy/State and Local Government. These concentrations allow you to tailor your studies to suit your interests and career goals while also developing specialized knowledge about a particular field within political science.

DEGREE OPTIONS

Bachelor of Arts in Political Science If you choose to pursue your Bachelor of Arts in Political Science you will need to complete the following course work:

- General Education requirements
- Demonstrate foreign language proficiency through level 2004
- 15 credit hours of core political science course work
- 3 credit hours in political theory
- 21 credit hours of political science electives
- A minimum of 120 credit hours of coursework

COURSE HIGHLIGHTS


Regardless of which degree option you choose, you will take 36 semester hours of core coursework, distributed throughout government, international relations, and political theory. Building on the foundation provided by your core classes, you can choose from elective courses that will help you develop your area of specialized interest such as POLS 3037 Campaigns and Elections, POLS 3039 Black Politics in America, POLS 3204 The American Judiciary, POLS 4382 Politics of Terrorism, and many more.

INTERNSHIPS

As a Political Science major, you should consider completing at least one internship during your time at ECU. Internships offer you the opportunity to gain practical experience in your field of study while also exploring potential career options for after you graduate. Speak with your advisor early to determine the best way to find the internship that is right for you. Pay attention to department emails that may be announcing internship opportunities for ECU Political Science majors.

FOURTH YEAR >>>

Complete POLS concentration requirements if you are a BS student or POLS electives if you are a BA student. Ensure that you have enough credit hours to graduate and have fulfilled all requirements for your minor. Apply for graduation and make plans to participate in university and department commencement ceremonies.

Volunteering for political, governmental, or social organizations is a great way to get experience in your field, build your résumé, test your interest in working with diverse populations, and develop your professional network.

Submit a proposal to present a polished research paper from one of your POLS classes at the <u>North Carolina Political</u> <u>Science Association</u> or another state or regional conference. Also Consider undergraduate research journals such as the <u>Pi Sigma Alpha Journal of</u> <u>Undergraduate Research</u>.

Take on a leadership position in one of your globally-oriented student organizations. Complete your program by incorporating more internationallyfocused courses.

Meet with your Career Counselor to put your post-graduation plans into action. Refine your résumé, <u>LinkedIn</u> profile, and interview skills. Complete the Pirate Employment Survey.
